

What to Pack for Shoots

For the Horse

Hint: It is a good idea to tack up the horse and then put everything in the trailer when you take it off the horse or go through this process in your mind. This will help you verify that all the parts of the saddle and bridle are included.

Saddles
Pads
Bridles/Tie downs/Reins
Saddle stands
Blankets
Hay
Grain
Water Buckets
Feed pans
Supplements?
Electrolytes (especially in hot weather)
Muck bucket
Stall Fork
1 wagon or cart to haul equipment

For the Humans

Guns
Gun belts
Clothes that meet CMSA dress code
Hat/Helmet
Boots and Spurs
Chinks (if wearing jeans)
Coats/jacket/raincoat
Long johns
Gloves
Hand warmers
Sunglasses
Sunscreen
Shower bag/Shave kit
Towels
Electric heater
Food (pack a lunch or bring money to eat, you will not have time to leave the grounds to eat during a shoot)
